Announcement of McGill Bursary Program

St. Paul' River- June 29th, 2015: McGill University, in partnership with the Coasters Association and its Networking Table (Lower North Shore Coalition for Health), will be once again be offering bursaries to students studying in Health and Social Service Programs on or off the Lower North Shore.

The purpose of the Bursary Program is to address the need for bilingual professionals in health and social services in selected Quebec regions by encouraging students to pursue studies in health and social service disciplines, in government recognized educational institutions outside their region, and return to their region to work and serve their communities.

The bursary amounts are fixed based on the student's level of study:

- University: Up to \$10,000 per year per student registered for full-time studies during winter 2014 academic year.
- Cégep / college: Up to \$5,000 per year per student registered for full-time studies during winter 2014 academic year.
- Secondary school vocational training: Up to \$5,000 per year per student registered for full-time studies during winter 2014 academic year.

All applications must be received no later than August 31st, 2015, at 5:00 pm. Three (3) applicants will be selected by a committee comprised of members from the Coasters Association, Centre de Santé de la Basse Cote Nord, Commission Scolaire du Littoral and Dr. Camille Marcoux Foundation, and submitted to McGill University.
