The purpose of this meeting was to introduce the Coasters Association structure to MAPAQ and to discuss the implication of the Lower North Shore in the 2021-23 MAPAQ action plan. 07. TRIBUTE TO EMMA BEAUDOIN

Emma Beaudion passed away on June 13th, 2021. She was a remarkable lady who always had the community at heart. Emma served as Manager of the Caisse Populaire de Blanc Sablon for many years and she was the driving force behind the installation of the branch office of the Caisse in Bonne Esperance. Emma was a founding member in the creation of the Uni-Aide Foundation back in 1992 along with a group of concerned citizens. This Foundation was established to provide support to residents from Old Fort to Blanc Sablon who could not afford to get the assistance they needed. In 2010, the Coasters established the Lower North Shore Cancer Fund (LNSCF) as one of the measures needed to support Cancer patients on the Lower North Shore. In 2012, Uni-Aide and the LNSCF met and determined that working together could better serve the **entire** population of the Lower North Shore. Thus, the Lower North Shore Health Fund (LNSHF) was born, and its mandate is to provide funds to **all** residents requiring financial support. Emma was an integral part of the amalgamation of both institutions and the LNSHF still provides assistance to residents. Emma's determination and fortitude ensured the success of this essential infrastructure on the Lower North Shore and her contribution was invaluable. She will be deeply missed.
